Coles New Town is set to close its doors later this evening, as it's set to receive a multi-million-dollar refurbishment. As of 10pm tonight the local supermarket will shut until late September as the new redevelopment will introduce an in-store bakery and also a continental delicatessen. Coles has stated the much-needed upgrade will provide multiple construction and retail jobs in the area, as well as

Locals have been assured that the store will continue to offer Click&Collect services and a dedicated free home delivery on all online orders.

Crucial road upgrades along the West Tamar highway have been finalised as part of a 14-million-dollar plan to improve the safety and longevity of one of the north's most populated pieces of road.

Hazel Brothers have been awarded the first four contracts as part of the six-point plan, which was outlines in conjunction with the 1.8 billion dollar "infrastructure blitz" mentioned by Premiere Peter Gutwein on Wednesday.

The upgrades include general widening of most of the highway and creating new footpaths between Rosevears Drive and Gravelly Beach Road, widening Atkinsons Road and Waldhorn Drive, widening the highway between Exeter and the Batman Highway Junction, and improvements to sight distance at the intersection of the West Tamar Highway and Motor Road.

With the arrest of an unsupervised learner driver with a full car and alcohol found in their system, Tasmanian Police have warned travellers that they'll be out patrolling the state this long weekend.
